




Four personality quadrants




Adding personality quadrants names

Quadrant names from 'Sex In The Snow' and 'Better Happy than Rich'




Adding Values descriptor labels







The arrows of time









Identifying Four political quadrants




Four political quadrants – Part 2



Four political quadrants - finally




Four political quadrants




Four personality quadrants

An Ethic of Peace and Nonviolence

1) The Minimization of Harm

Both between humans, and in the relations of humans with not-humans

2) The Maximization of Well-being

Of 'one within all' and 'all within one', by 'all within all'

The Ordinate Question of Equality

- The 'Inequality ~ Fearfulness ~ Selfishness' spiral
- The 'Selfish needs ~ Social needs' tension *
- Happiness = (Human) needs met *
- Happiness => Peacefulness
- Peacefulness <=> Equality <=> Co-operation
- These impel the necessity for:
 - a politics / economics / sociology / ethics
 - with orientation and process to, and of,
 - equality, freedom, and self-selected, co-operative, globalised responsibility – ie: 'Co-operative Socialism'

Realizing Co-operative Socialism A Values and Principles basis

The Statement on the Co-operative Identity
The International Co-operative Alliance
(Manchester, UK 1995)

a) Definition:

A co-operative is an autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet their common economic, social, and cultural needs and aspirations through a jointly-owned and democratically-controlled enterprise.

ICA Statement on the Co-operative Identity - Values

b) Values

Co-operatives are based on the values of self-help, self-responsibility, democracy, equality, equity and solidarity.

In the tradition of their founders, co-operative members believe in the ethical values of honesty, openness, social responsibility and caring for others.

ICA Statement on the Co-operative Identity – Principles

c) The Co-operative Principles are guidelines by which co-operatives put their values into practice.

1st Principle: Voluntary and Open Membership

... are voluntary organisations, open to all ... willing to accept the responsibilities of membership, without ... discrimination.

2nd Principle: Democratic Member Control

Co-operatives are democratic organisations controlled by their members . . .

3rd Principle: Member Economic Participation

... Members usually receive limited compensation, if any, on capital subscribed ...

Members allocate surpluses ... developing their co-operative ...; benefiting members in proportion to their transactions ... supporting other activities approved by the membership.

ICA Statement on the Co-operative Identity – Principles (continued)

4th Principle: Autonomy and Independence

Co-operatives are autonomous, self-help organisations controlled by their members. If they enter to agreements . . . they do so on terms that ensure democratic control by their members and maintain their co-operative autonomy.

5th Principle: Education, Training and Information

Co-operatives provide education and training for their members, elected representatives, managers, and employees . . .

They inform the general public - particularly young people and opinion leaders - about the nature and benefits of co-operation.

6th Principle: Co-operation among Co-operatives


Co-operatives serve their members most effectively and strengthen the cooperative movement by working together through local, national, regional and international structures.

7th Principle: Concern for Community

Co-operatives work for the sustainable development of their communities through policies approved by their members.
